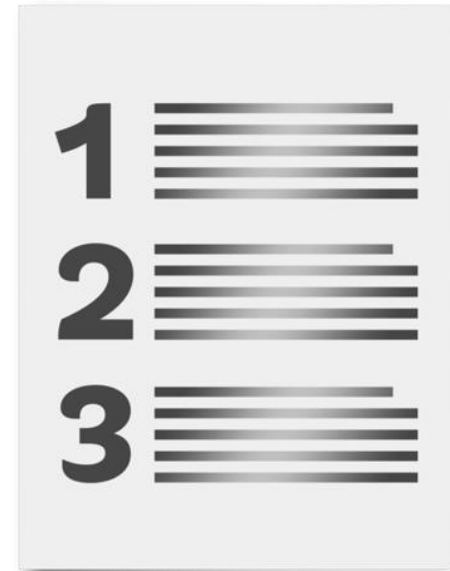


# **How are families and carers involved in the Transforming Care Programme in Hertfordshire?**

# What is Transforming Care?

- A national programme to improve care and support for adults and children with a learning disability, autism or both
- Led by NHS England, the Association of Directors of Adult Social Services (ADASS) and the Local Government Association
- The programme runs from 2015 - 2019



# Building the Right Support

- National plan and service model
- Develops local services and support
- Moving people out of hospital
- Stop people being sent into hospital
- Better support means better lives



# Transforming Care Partnerships (TCPs)

- Making sure Building the Right Support happens
- 48 TCPs created across England
- Clinical Commissioning Groups, NHS, local authorities
- Involves individuals, self advocates, parents, families and carers
- Sharing ideas and making plans for local areas

- The Strategy Unit – researchers who are part of the NHS
- ICF – Experts in evaluation and research
- Health Services Management Centre – academic experts from the University of Birmingham
- BILD – the British Institute of Learning Disabilities

- Has the work of the TCP led to people with learning disabilities having better lives?
